District 5670 - 2017-2018



DISTRICT-SPECIFIC DETAILS

- Application deadline: **Friday, September 29, 2017**
- Funding limit: **Up to \$1,000** per application (dollar-for-dollar match)



GENERAL GRANT GUIDELINES

- Any District 5670 Rotary Club that has contributed to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) in the 2016-2017 Rotary year (July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017) is eligible to apply. However, the level of TRF giving may influence grant award decisions.
- The application deadline (Friday, September 29, 2017) is a FIRM deadline.
- Applicants must document a dollar-for-dollar match to requested funding.
- Grant projects are expected to be completed within 12 months of receipt of grant funds, but in no circumstances more than 24 months from receipt of grant funds.
- An INTERIM REPORT is required for projects not completed by June 30, 2018; a FINAL REPORT is required for ALL projects upon completion or no later than December 31, 2018.



PROJECT GUIDELINES

Projects must:

- Relate to the mission of The Rotary Foundation...*"to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty."*
- Include the active participation of Rotarians.
- Exclude any liability to The Rotary Foundation or Rotary International except for the funding amount of the awarded grant.
- Adhere to the governing laws of the United States and the country where the activity is taking place and not harm individuals or entities.
- Include signage on or in conjunction with the project that identifies the role of the grant sponsor (i.e. the local Rotary club) and The Rotary Foundation in accordance with Rotary's "Voice and Visual Identity Guidelines" (found at www.rotary.org).



EXCLUSIONS

District grants cannot fund:

- Projects already in progress or completed.
- Projects from clubs that do not meet TRF contribution guidelines (see above).
- Projects from clubs that have not yet completed a previous TRF District Grant-funded project and submitted the required Final Report on that project.
- Continuous or excessive support of any one project, beneficiary, entity or community.
- The purchase of land or buildings or new construction of any structure in which individuals live, work, study, etc.
- Rotary fundraising activities, events, public relations initiatives or operating/administration expenses.
- Activities primarily implemented by a non-Rotary organization.
